 <p>Planning: Aligning enterprise security capabilities with law enforcement field requirements.</p>	 <p>Collection: Capturing live threat data directly from the asset source while a crime is occurring.</p>	 <p>Processing: Filtering out technical noise to ensure absolute data clarity for emergency responders.</p>	 <p>Analysis Workflow: Instantly verifying the alert to eliminate false alarms and confirm an active threat.</p>	 <p>Dissemination: Delivering the verified, source-level intelligence straight to local police dispatch to safely guide units on the ground.</p>

Technique	Operational Application
Source Intelligence	Real-time digital security assets are provided by enterprise businesses to capture active threats.
Surveillance Data	Live visual or digital confirmation from the scene establishes absolute proof of criminal activity.
Network Mapping	Utilizing open-source intelligence (OSINT) post-apprehension to identify broader criminal syndicates.
Direct Delivery	Utilizing a Verified Priority Pathway to route critical data directly to dispatch without IT friction.
